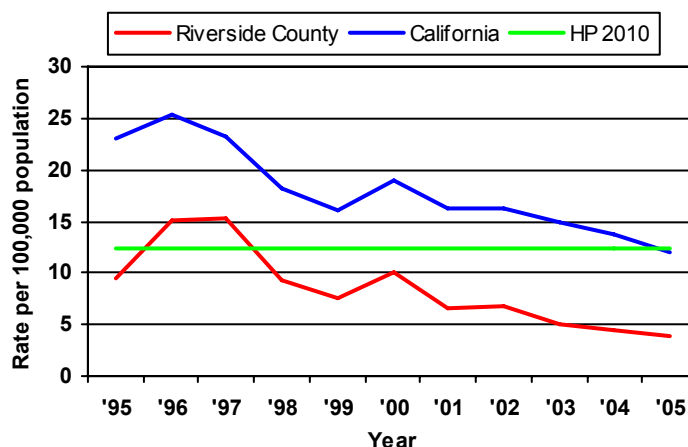


CAMPYLOBACTERIOSIS

DISEASE ABSTRACT

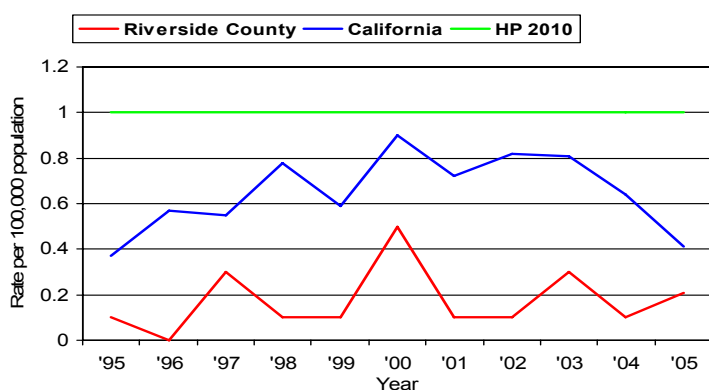
- Seventy-three cases of campylobacteriosis were reported in 2005, with an incidence rate of 3.9 cases per 100,000 population.
- Since 1998, Riverside County incidence rates for campylobacteriosis have been below the Healthy People 2010 objective of 12.3 cases per 100,000 population.

DISEASE ABSTRACT

- E. Coli O157:H7 is rarely reported in Riverside County with an average of two cases per year, and an incidence rate well below the Healthy People 2010 goal of one case per 100,000 population.

GIARDIASIS

DISEASE ABSTRACT

- Twenty-three cases of giardiasis were reported in 2005 with an incidence rate of 1.2 cases per 100,000 population.
- The incidence rates of giardiasis in Riverside County and California continues to decline with the current rates of reported disease one-tenth the rates in 1992.
